

Spam...not

Region 26 Guidelines

Region 26 recognizes that each chorus has its own culture and operating Guidelines and recommends that those Guidelines include sections on the use of social media and privacy and spam laws. The Region is not qualified to give you legal advice but would make you aware of the following:

Social Media:

Official Sweet Adeline International Contest recordings may only be used for Educational purposes and if a chorus wishes to upload or use these recordings for any other purpose, the chorus must seek the explicit permission of SAI Music Services Department.

Each chorus in Region will exercise discretion around placing any images or recordings onto websites, YouTube, Facebook, twitter etc. of chorus members and/or events, and will uphold the Sweet Adeline image of smart and gracious women.

RMT recommends that each chorus select a team of two or more members who are responsible for ascertaining the appropriateness of, and posting of, images and recordings in social media.

RMT recommends that all choruses request their members sign a disclaimer allowing the use of

members' images, if a member does not consent to their image being used for particular purposes this is their right. Please note that there is no control of image or recording when performing in a public place.

Privacy:

Canada has legislation regarding the collection, use and disclosure of an individual's personal information. Though our choruses have little commercial activity, it is recommended that a very minimum of personal information be collected and held by any chorus and that the use and any disclosure of that personal information is understood by the owner and permission for the use and disclosure is obtained.

Spam Legislation:

As stated previously, our choruses do not have a lot of commercial activity but if you maintain e-mail lists of show customers, cd purchasers or any other commercial activity, you now need to get, and keep a record of, explicit permission to maintain these individuals on your mailing lists. This is a general statement covering the legislation, there are a number of legal firm sites that have more detailed information.
