


Donna Dunning - Incoming Membership Coordinator

UPLOADING PERFORMANCE VIDEOS ONTO SOCIAL MEDIA

Do you or your chorus want to upload videos of your performances onto your website or YouTube for public viewing? Here's what you need to know.

Using copyright-protected music in any form requires permission; to arrange and print, to perform in public (free or ticketed), or to record. A mechanical license is required for a CD; a synchronization license if you pair music with a visual product, like a video or film.

While there are agencies that handle mechanical and performance licensing, and have set fees, synch licenses are negotiated directly with the copyright owner. Permission might even be granted for free.

You may ask, "With the proliferation of videos on social media, who's going to notice if we put our little video on our website, in order to perpetuate the art form, and attract new members?" You may be correct, as it's not easy to police, but the composer is entitled to profit financially from his/her product.

To protect itself legally, YouTube is set up to favour the copyright owner, and "assumes" that anyone who posts on their site has permission. Further, they have "um-

brella" contracts with the major publishers, and scan every new upload. Then, they monetize the product by selling advertising, and share the revenue with copyright owners.

If a copyright or licensing violation is detected, You-Tube will inform the uploader, and offer some options: to remove the video, or to agree to the placement of advertising. I consulted with the Westminster Chorus on this issue. They upload a lot of videos, and always choose the second option. It amounts to asking forgiveness, rather than permission, but in the end, everyone is happy, and no one is threatened with legal action.

Rarely, the copyright owner will choose not to allow the upload, in which case YouTube will remove the video altogether, or will mute the audio portion of the video.

That's it in a nutshell. If it were up to me, I'd choose content that presents the image you want the public to see, and join the rest of the barbershop world in using this new technology.




