nomination for the 2016 Canadian Music Educators Award (CMEA) which will be presented at the Las **Vegas International Competition** this October!

"Patti was raised in a barbershop family and that thread has been securely woven into her career as a music educator for almost three decades. As a proud Sweet Adeline she employs her barbershop skills in selecting music, choir directing, teaching vocal production, motivating performers to

excel, and building a supportive musical community."

Among her many accomplishments, Patti is ground shaking." has been the co-director of the Langley ~Patti Thorpe Children's choir since 1991, and co-founded the amazing Westcoast Harmony Chorus's Young Women in Harmony program in 2004 with Christine MacKenzie.

In addition to Patti's passion and achievements in education, this nomination and award would not have come to fruition without the tireless efforts of Joey Minshall, Margaret Sampson, and other members of the Region and Management Team - thank you to all that made this happen.

Patti is overjoyed about the nomination and award. When asked what her reaction was when she received the phone call from SAI President, Paula Davis, she said

> there were a lot of tears and subsequent phone calls made to friends and family to share the news. She is still in disbelief and says, "I have seen the American award presented countless times and the idea that my name will be first on the Canadian award? Crazy!"

Patti can't imagine her life without Sweet Adelines. "I have learned (and continue to learn) so much from this amazing organization".

"Patti's SAI skills have influenced our young singers in their ability to sing in close harmony, to sing a cappella,

and to sing with their whole bodies... Imagining Patti without the influence of SAI is impossible, probably as impossible as it is to imagine your organization without her. Every year I'm reminded how lucky I and all of our singers are to get to work with her." -Kim Hardy, friend & Co-Worker

Carol was instrumental in many community projects such as Meals on Wheels, Burnabettes and at the school with the kids. Carol loved to sew. She did costume construction and reconstruction for all her children and then for her grandchildren. She joined Sweet Adelines and helped establish (Burnaby Chorus) Westcoast Harmony Chorus, where she sang and continued to sew while serving in leadership roles in Region 26. Carol and Abie were cornerstone supporters of barbershop singing in this part of the world. In all things she was an organizer, and was also hardworking, energetic and always willing to pitch in and help to get things done. Sadly, her vibrancy was taken from her in recent years with the development of Parkinsons Desease.

Our thoughts are with the Klassen family. Carol was the ultimate Mom, friend and Sweet Adeline. We will all cherish the memories and love Carol shared with us.

Muriel will be remembered for her vibrancy, kindness, and her always-present sense of fun. 'Can You Feel the Love Tonight' was Muriel's favorite chorus song. We silently dedicate it to her memory each and every time it is sung.

As Musical Director of the San Diego Chorus since 1985, Kim Vaughn led the chorus to multiple successes, including the International championship in 2001 and a 2014 regional score of 708, earning her the title of Master 700 Director. She recently retired from directing and spends many months of the year away from home, coaching around the world. Kim was also the Musical Director of Pacific Coast Harmony, a men's barbershop harmony chorus.

Kim has won the International Quartet Champion title three times, and is the first woman to ever do so. She won her first title in 1976 with High Society, again in 1988 with Savvy, and most recently in 2001 with a cappella Gold.

A vocal teacher and member of the National Association of Teachers of Singing, Kim holds a B.A. in Music Education and an M.A. in Vocal Pedagogy from San Diego State University. She is also a certified judge in the Sound category as well as International Faculty for Sweet Adelines.

Congratulations! How did it feel to win audience choice?

Do you have any advice for new quartets? Decide what kind of quartet you would like to be, which will help determine how much time, coaching and hard work will be required. Choose a coach or coaches to help you prog-

ress. Record coaching sessions, make notes, and follow through on their advice. Get as many performance opportunities as possible. Sing, have fun and laugh!



What's next for VOX?

Build a good repertoire, perform often, continue to develop our personal and quartet musical skills. At contest in 2017 our new goal is to improve our score.


Uptown Suite



It felt so great to see all the hard work that we put in pay off on the score sheets. I'm pretty sure everyone in the hotel could hear our excited screams..!


You obviously worked really hard over the past year – what was key in your jump to the next level?
