### Sandy Marron's 25th Anniversary

November 1, 1991 was an auspicious and pivotal date in the life of Lions Gate Chorus. It was the day that Sandy

Robinson agreed to be our director! Having recently graduated from the Director's Certification Program in Burnaby Chorus (now Westcoast Harmony), she was looking for a challenge and Cammi MacKinlay, then President of Lions Gate, just happened to make that phone call of invitation that changed our lives dramatically! And the rest, as they say, is history!

Under Sandy's leadership and with her amazing teaching skills, in the past 25 years Lions Gate has earned eleven regional gold medals, a record-breaking regional score of 703 in 2016, and five top five International medals, no mean achievement for a chorus from Region 26! Sandy became a Master Director in 1999 with a regional score of 630, and then a Master 700 Director in Nashville 2009, with a record-breaking semi-finals score of 1488 (equivalent to 744 at regional). The climb has been slow and steady, with a few bumps

> along the way, but just think what the next few years will bring! With Sandy at the helm, anything is possible!

Lions Gate held two parties to celebrate Sandy's 25th anniversary – one on Saturday October 29 and the second one on the actual date of the anniversary, which happened to be our regular

chorus rehearsal night. We welcomed current and former members and guests to both soirees, and reminisced with a costume parade, anecdotes of memorable moments in Sandy's life as a director, speeches recognizing her importance in our lives, a video compilation of snippets of contests and shows and performances from 1995 until now, a retrospective of Sandy's directorship put together by Corinne Newell, a photo booth for candid photos, a Love Box full of thank you notes and of course, gifts! Elvera Collier hand-quilted a beautiful lion for Sandy, we purchased a brick in her honour on the Sweet Adelines International headquarters patio and we presented her with a custom-made silver pendant of the Lions Gate logo.

All in all, Sandy was celebrated for the talented, incredible woman and director that she is, the driving force behind Lions Gate's success. She eats, sleeps and breathes the chorus and we are all the stronger for it! Here's to the next 25 years!



#### 3 - Chapter Leader Forums at (RES) 2017

Regional Education Symposium (RES) in Edmonton AB August 17-20,2017 at Grant McEwan College, featuring great classes led by FRENZY! newly crowned International Champion quartet will also include forums for Directors and Team Coordinators/Chapter Presidents as well as Finance Coordinators and Membership/Marketing Coordinators. *Education* - Region 26 leaders collaborate to provide unlimited access to knowledge and resources for its members. *Excellence* - Region 26 operates with the philosophy and practices that enable long-term, consistent achievement of our goals, and increasingly higher levels of performance.

#### Lisa Greenough, Gateway Chorus, Edmonton Alberta

As a 28 year Sweet Adeline there aren't many jobs Lisa hasn't done. Starting out as duty coffee and snacks coordinator in her first chorus at 16 to now front line Master Director and Approved Candidate Judge (Sh). In between those years she has served as section leader and assistant in multiple sections, assistant director, co-director, choreographer, regional education faculty and coach to many! She believes leadership is a role best served from a service perspective. 'What can she do for you to make you more successful?' In her role as the Director Coordinator she is looking forward to connecting with all the Region 26 Directors and assisting them to further develop their leadership and directing skills and finding both personal and professional success.

#### Kathryn Roberts, Gateway Chorus, Edmonton Alberta

Kathryn's a capella career began in 2003, as a tenor in Gateway Chorus in Edmonton Alberta. During the week days, she is a Business Analyst at Alberta Health Services. Her other harmony love is singing in N'Intrigue Quartet. She has been on the Gateway Chorus management team as Events Coordinator and Communication Coordinator for years, and enjoyed the challenge of fundraising in the past. Kathryn believes in the sisterhood of Sweet Adelines, and says it is an awesome place to grow, and express oneself artistically.

#### Gateway Chorus Drives Differently

It's January and Gateway Chorus is taking advantage of the New Year's resolutions season to focus on self-improvement goals that people tend to generate at this time of year.

Gateway doesn't do scheduled membership drives, per se.

It isn't all about the numbers though. Gateway has been a mid-size chorus for over 20 years, which hasn't hindered their success. Greenough says, "I don't so much look at the numbers of bodies, but the success and development I see in the chorus both as individual members as well as the whole"



They do membership "pushes" or highlighting events throughout the year, typically in the fall, pre-Christmas, post-Christmas, and postcontest. Right now, they are putting together a "Resolution You Can Keep" type of push, says director Lisa Greenough.

Marketing for new members is an on-going process. This past fall, they did some online pushes for women to come and visit and check things out. In December of 2015 Gateway put together a "Sing with Us" push where women could join the chorus for Christmas songs at their annual Christmas performance. Like many choruses, Gateway finds that their membership "pushes" or drives are initially successful in terms of interest, but the potential new members find it challenging to fit the whole package into their schedules. Gateway is currently working on removing those challenges and obstacles for new incoming members.

In putting together their advertisements, Gateway draws upon the Sweet Adelines graphics available online in the marketing area, and they use some of the recommended script too. But for the most part, Gateway tries to use language that reflects who Gateway is specifically. Greenough recommends making membership advertising as authentic as possible. Are you a sing-for-fun kind of chorus or a hard working, skill-development type chorus? Let your audience know. "The more authentic and real you are in your advertising the better chance you have of finding the ladies that will be a good fit on both sides"

At the end of the day, whether five women, ten women, or only one woman finds Gateway Chorus through a membership "push", they know it's a been success.

#### Rhyhtm of the Rockies

Last Fall, Rhythm of the Rockies tried out a new approach to their membership drive.

The management team decided to invite women from around Calgary to come and sing with them on their Christmas show, Speaking of Christmas. Rhythm of the Rockies had heard of other choruses in Region 26 doing this type of membership drive and they also found some information on the Sweet Adelines website about other groups in which this had become their main source of new members, so they decided to try it out. The newbies were dubbed the "A Capella Christmas" members, and in total there were 30 new faces on the risers for the Christmas show.

Through widespread advertising and word-of-mouth, over 40 visitors came through the door to check out the chorus. The management team had three people dedicated to advertising and marketing and they set up road signs and online posters, which were featured on kijiji, community websites, community boards, radio station boards, and social media. Rhythm of the Rockies is fortunate to have several members with business and marketing experience. A lot of research was done on the best locations for the road signs, and it ended up paying off. Many of the women who walked through the door said it was the road signs that caught their attention.

Rhythm of the Rockies director, Mary Hager, committed 3 months to the program. At each rehearsal, 90 minutes was spent focusing on the A Capalla Christmas women and teaching them the foundational skills of singing a cappella. After those 90 minutes, Hager continued with the regularly scheduled rehearsal, which included more Christmas songs and barbershop too. The A Capella Christmas members Throughout the membership drive, there were two Rhythm of the Rockies members who stayed connected with all of the visitors to make them feel



were always encouraged to stay for the second half of the rehearsal to see more of how the chorus worked, and to listen to them rehearse the rest of the program.

The A Capella Christmas visitors even got the pleasure of experiencing an evening of voice placement with the chorus and were encouraged to attend a coaching session too. a part of the group.

Rhythm of the Rockies is very happy with the results of their membership drive this year. Of the 30 A Capella Christmas members who sang on the show, four have since auditioned and become full-fledged new members of the group.

Corinna is well known and loved around the world as the tenor of 2012 International Quartet Champion **Martini**. She also arrangers, coaches, teaches, writes, is Associate (Master) Director of Lions Gate Chorus, an Approved Music Judge, serves on R26's REF, and is currently in her first term on SAI's Education Direction Committee. Shannon is Region 26's one-and-only (so far!) "Double Oueen"! A member of Lions Gate Chorus, Shannon won her first crown in 2004 as the bass of Brava! and her second in 2012 as the bass of Martini. I guess that makes her a 'Double Bass' Queen! Anne is a Master Director (Westcoast Harmony Chorus) and the baritone of our newly-crowned 2017 International Quartet Champions, Frenzy! Anne also serves on R26 REF and SAI's Music Sales & Marketability Committee.

The Chorus Contest on Satur-

day April 29th will be anchored by Elaine Cotton, with co-hosts Lvnn Tatton and Cammi MacKinlav. Elaine is an Associate Director of Lions Gate Chorus, and the baritone of R26's muchloved first-ever International Ouartet, Brava! (2004) Lynn is the lead of that same muchloved Brava! guartet, served for a number of years on R26's REF, and contributed much queenly expertise to her home chorus of many years, Westcoast Harmony Chorus. Cammi has so many listings under her bio we can hardly fit them all in here! She is a PIP (Past International President of SAI (2010-12), and currently serves not only at the

chapter level as Team Coordinator for Lions Gate Chorus, but also at the regional level on R26's REF, and internationally on the IBOD. She is an International Faculty member, Chair of the Regional Leadership Coordinators team, and is Co-Chair of IES 2017 "Back To The Future". AND she sings in a quartet, Fandango! Oh and she's a Panel Secretary and on the Editorial Review Board for the PitchPipe Magazine. Yoiks! That is one busy woman!
