Magic City Chorus of Saskatoon, Saskatchewan hosted a retreat in March, which was enthusiastically referred to as "HARMONY EXPLOSION 2018". The purpose of the weekend was to set aside time to focus on building the strong bond required not only to sing to our full potential but work together as a committed chorus family to achieve our wildest

dreams. Members committed their time and energy. Mothers arranged babysitters, employees took time off work and even snow birds flew home for the occasion.

This would be our first chorus retreat experience and the excitement was buzzing for weeks leading up to the event. With a little help from our friend and chorus coach, Corinna Garriock, we were able to dig

You show up to a coaching retreat to improve the quality of your contest songs and leave with an incredible feeling of belonging, emotional connections and endless potential. "magic".

#### BREAKING NEWS... Important Rechartering New Policy From Sweet Adelines International

The recommendations accepted by the International Board of Directors were as follows:

**RECOMMENDATION #1**: That effective May 1, 2018, a chapter may re-charter with as few as 12 members, plus a director. Public performance requires all four singing parts.

**RECOMMENDATION #2**: That effective May 1, 2018, chapters with fewer than 12 members are required to enter Revitalization Status, with annual re-charter fees and competition rules waived. Public performance requires all four singing parts.

**RECOMMENDATION #3**: That effective May 1, 2018, a chapter currently in Revitalization status, and having more than 12 members, plus a director, can choose to complete Revitalization status for up to two years, dependent on the original start date of Revitalization

status, or choose to regain full chartered chapter status, which includes annual re-charter fees and competing once every three years.

The RLC (Regional Leadership Committee) /ILS is strongly recommending that any chorus whose numbers dip below 15, even if they do not go into Revitalization, be given extra help and support to retain those numbers and build their membership back up. This can be in the form of visits, coaching, mentorship, Skype coaching, access to educational materials, financial help to attend workshops, etc. This change will not affect the initial chartering policy, which is that a chorus must have 15 plus a Director in order to charter as a new chorus.

We hope that this new policy will be beneficial for choruses who are in the situation of having between 12 and 15 singing members and Regional Leaders who work with them.

## Prairie Gold Chorus – After 35 years, they're still "Feeling the Love"



Located in the heart of the prairies and in Saskatchewan's Queen City, Regina, the Prairie Gold Chorus got its start in September 1981 with 12 women who loved to sing. With the addition of 11 members, in February 1983, Sweet Adelines International announced the official charter of the Prairie Gold Chorus as the newest small chorus in

Region 26. This year, 2018, marks Prairie Gold's 35th anniversary. In February, they had a party to celebrate their actual charter date.



Since its inception, Prairie Gold has had remarkable success. With Director Rose Peddle, they placed second, among 18 choruses, in their very first competition in Calgary in the spring of 1983. That was the beginning of an incredible journey. In its history, Prairie Gold has received thirty regional awards, including eight 1st place small chorus and two 1st place mid-size chorus awards. Twice they were the most improved chorus. They have also been part of some international firsts. In 1996, with Marlene Greenough directing, the chorus attended the first 'small chorus festival' in St. Louis, Missouri. Then, in 2000, Prairie Gold travelled to San Antonio, Texas to compete in the first 'harmony classic' at IES, where, with Director Chris Evans, they placed 4th in the world and brought home Region 26's first International chorus medal. In July 2003, Prairie Gold gualified to compete

internationally in Greenville, South Carolina. After many hours of practicing, polishing and perfecting, the chorus took its package to the International stage where, one point out of first place, they placed 2nd, bringing home their second International chorus medal. Again, in October 2009, with co-directors Helen Olinik and Valerie Neison, Prairie Gold appeared on the International Competition stage in Nashville, Tennessee. This was the first Harmony Classic to be held directly in conjunction with the SAI International Convention. The chorus was bursting with pride when it brought home its third International medal, having placed 5th in the world. Chorus directorship has changed several times and has included Marg Ohm as well as our current Director Denise Lindenbach.



A common thread in this amazing musical tapestry is Helen Olinik, who has been there since the beginning. Helen joined Sweet Adelines in 1976 as a member of the chorus in Moose Jaw, SK and later transferred membership to Regina Chorus in Regina, SK. Helen is a charter member of Prairie Gold Chorus. After 35 years, she is Prairie Gold's one remaining, active charter member. Helen has been involved in every aspect of chorus life from physical and vocal warm-ups to administration, having served as President, Vice-President, Rules and Bylaws Chair, Publicity Chair, Education Chair, and Music Librarian. She has been on the music team, and the choreography, and costume committees. With a background in piano, tap dancing, and voice training and having played numerous instruments including piano, drums, saxophone, banjo,

accordion and guitar, Helen is a true 'student of music'. When Helen joined Sweet Adelines, she was like a sponge, absorbing everything she could. She achieved her Certified Director status because she wanted to be a better section leader. She is a driving force on the choreography team where her talents, experience and creativity are put to



good use. This passion is evident at her home where she had a wall of mirrors installed in her basement so she could hold extra choreo rehearsals. Helen participated in an international Director's Retreat in Tulsa, Oklahoma and a choreo workshop in Detroit, Michigan, as well as numerous International Education Symposia. She regularly attends regional events and has been present at almost every International Competition and Convention. Helen is currently Assistant Director, Vice-President, choreographer, a member of the music team and the costume committee ,and schedules vocal and physical warm-ups. Helen sings baritone with the chorus and has competed regionally with the well known quartet "A Touch of Gold", which formed in 1990 and is still performing. Helen is typically the first one at rehearsal and the last one to leave and rarely misses a rehearsal or performance. She has twice been Prairie Gold's nominee for Region 26's Spirit of 26 Award. Helen epitomizes the term 'chorus leader'. She is positively energetic, enthusiastic, kind, humble and generous with her musical talents, knowledge, time and love for our art form.

As Prairie Gold celebrates a milestone 35th anniversary, it is fitting

to celebrate Helen's milestone membership and her contribution and unwavering dedication to the success and longevity of this chorus. On Saturday, April 21st, the Chorus will be holding a special "Feeling the Love" 35th anniversary celebration for family and friends at 7:30 p.m. at the Doubletree by Hilton Hotel & Conference Centre, 1975 Broad Street, Regina, SK. ### The Power of a Community Performance - Part Two

In the January 2018 issue of the *Maple Leaf Express*, Emily Holtorf-Ma from Lions Gate Chorus wrote an article call "The Power of a Community Performance" where she made us think about the impact our public performance can have on both our chorus and the audience itself. She shared how Cammi Mackinlay's chance overlap with Lions Gate at a community function changed not only her personal life but also that of the chorus's history. Chinook Winds Show Chorus would like to share their story that also reinforces the power of a community performance.



Two years ago, our chorus adopted a government funded senior care centre for Christmas. We bought presents for 56 of the residents, collected money at our chorus Christmas party to put towards a bigger gift, and then joined them for a Christmas party where we sang, laughed and visited. The gifts were left to be opened on Christmas morning and what a morning they had. Most of the residents had no family so we really made their Christmas and they made ours.

This past year, we took on an even bigger project, 248 residents at Cedars Villa Extendicare. Cathy Carson, our Special Events Coordinator and I were a bit taken aback by the number of residents but decided to go forward with it, dividing up the list so each sheet had 6 names. We had about 36 active members at that time so we anticipated that we would be doing a lot of shopping ourselves. As it turned out, our chorus members dived in, grabbed multiple lists and they were off! We

had to fight to get any of the lists. To be honest, it was quite heartbreaking to see how little people asked for - a box of kleenex, a bag of cheezies, hand lotion, shampoo, nail clippers, etc. By December 19th, the gifts were wrapped and on their way through the first big snow storm of the season. Although the roads were in terrible shape, that didn't stop our merry band of festively dressed performers. The seniors that were entertained by Chinook Winds Show Chorus that night were singing right along with us, smiling and engaging, and after, loved being able to have the small visits from the members circulating. They were so very appreciative that we were all there to sing to them on such a snowy night. For some that rarely smile or engage, we brought out their "happy" and that's what it is all about. A short time later, the facility contacted us to share their Christmas story. "On Friday, December 22, all staff were called in to assist with distributing your gifts to the residents. As staffing is pretty skeletal over the holidays, Cedars decided to take advantage that every caregiver was available to bring ALL residents together in one area, and the staff "played Santa". The gifts had been sorted



by House name a couple of days before and once the residents were all together, every staff member appeared loaded with Christmas presents. The residents were like children - smiles and laughter all around while opening their gifts, they were overjoyed. It was a party and the staff were thrilled. Several seniors could not stop thanking their Santa." Following this visit, we learned there were remarkable attitude changes in some seniors and it was great to see so many smiles, laughter and conversations.

Cathy and I were humbled by the generosity of our members and their willingness to give their time and their voices. They had a huge impact on the lives of these seniors last holiday season and we are proud to be members of such a wonderful chorus! Did we get any members out of this activity, no, but what we got was so much better. Something to keep in mind the next time a smaller "gig" comes around and you realize the power of a community performance.
